


The World of Kāru

Kāru is an expedition to restore biodiversity to recovering ecosystems. An invitation to live with nature and rediscover its magic.

Kāru's home is a 15-acre slope on the Western Ghats of Kerala. The property was once lived in and cared for by local tea growers. Development came and the hills were abandoned. The tea bushes turned to trees and the land lay forgotten for 20 years.

Now, as Kāru, we are working to heal this land—to reintroduce the wild and cultivate sustainable farming practices within its fertile boundaries.



In today's urban environments, children are increasingly cut off from nature and physical work. This has direct implications on their mental health, emotional wellbeing, resilience and their ability to work with their hands.

Kāru presents a bold alternative: a curated nature-immersion program that schools can book for their students. Our model brings risk back into education in safe, meaningful ways—helping children grow stronger, more curious, and more connected to the wild.

Our Rewilding Expeditions pay a 10% commission on participant fees to the school, along with end-to-end logistical handling and travel organisation. All we need is a single point of contact at the school.


